Gould Academy seeks a FIS Alpine Coach to join our beautiful outdoor community working alongside various On Snow enthusiasts in our athletics department. This role is responsible for all aspects of coaching alpine athletes and leadership of the FIS alpine program. Works in conjunction with the Alpine Director for management and program delivery for all Alpine Gould Academy as well as Sunday River's weekend program.

Our highly qualified, full-time coaching team allows athletes to compete in a variety of schedules—from state USSS races to international FIS events. Gould alpine skiers are members of United States Ski and Snowboard (USSS) and compete at the U18, U16, U14 & U12 levels. Our Alpine Program prepares student-athletes to compete at the highest levels in each age group. We strike a balance of technical skills between free skiing and gate training at Sunday River Resort, while offering the best opportunity for student-athletes to reach their potential. Gould also manages a 250+ member weekend club-level program with athletes ranging from 7-17 years old. This rich gathering of development-age skiers ensures a steady pipeline of potential U19/16 academy level USSS and FIS future athletes.

Coaching

- Coach FIS alpine athletes
- Daily preparation of the training venue (course set, fencing, snow preparation, etc)
- Manage athlete transportation for daily training and races
- Transport on-snow athletes to/from airport
- Assist athletes with gear selection and maintenance
- Coach and support commercial ski training camps that support underclass enrollment
- Coach and or administer summer ski camps
- Regular communication with athletes, parents, and faculty
- Participate in Professional Development Clinics/training
- Present to Weekend Alpine Coaches as needed

Travel Protocol / Camps / Overnight Trip

- 24 hr supervisory duties to include downtime, warm-up and cool down training, supervised study hall, equipment maintenance, and nutritional health and sleep habits

Management

- Plan offseason on snow training camps May- October
- Manage year-long training and race schedule for alpine athletes
- Plan and present coaches education programming
- Manage athlete equipment in cooperation with Sunday River Speedworks and equipment manufacturers
- Manages budget to meet annual enrollment goals
- Plan athlete travel for in-season race and training opportunities
- Manage and maintain alpine program equipment (gates, timing, video, etc)
- Ensure that GACP athletes comply with the Code of Conduct and the GACP Participation Agreement

Professionalism

- Attendance and participation in team and organization meetings
- Prompt and frequent communication with athletes, parents, and faculty
- Involvement with USSA regional and national committees

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Qualifications

- Equivalent to skills required for Level 200 education in US Ski and Snowboard Coaches Education program. PSIA or equivalent acceptable
- Minimum of three seasons as a coach in an organized US Ski and Snowboard, collegiate, or high school racing program; or have experience at the NorAm level
- Certified US Ski & Snowboard Referee Race Official
- CPR, First Aid and Safe Sport Certified (or willingness to be trained)
- Basic software literacy in Microsoft Office/ Google Suite
- Valid passport and US driver's license
- Pass a criminal and sexual offender background check
- Obtain CHRC clear status from the Maine Department of Education

Physical Work Environment

- Ability to ski while carrying more than 50lbs of equipment
- Occasional prolonged and irregular hours, working November through April up to 7 days a week
- Frequent standing, stooping, bending, kneeling, pushing and pulling
- Occasional lifting up to 10-30 pounds of supplies
- Must be able to travel to all campus locations and to appropriate training and meetings
- Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions

Compensation and Benefits

This is a full-time, year round, exempt position beginning July 1, 2023.
